


An at-sea processor should:




Quality Control Technician

Be a team player Like people of all cultures Not be prone to seasickness Be healthy, physically fit Like to see results of work

Precautions processing at-sea Get a written contract! (Generally 3 to 4) months) Make sure company has good reputation Prepare for homesickness Must complete work contract Be medically healthy, pass pre-hire physical and drug screen Work long hours in wet, cold environment Able to lift 50 pounds Endure zero tolerance work environment Recognize no fish-no work, no work-no pay




Factory Vessel Organization – <u>Bridge</u>*








Factory Vessel Organization – Engineering*





